<b>Accommodation</b>	<p>The best way to find accommodation is asking the coordinator of the program or other teachers in the school. Some of them live in the town and personally know people who offer apartments or houses to rent.</p> <p>If you prefer to live in Granada city, this implies commuting by public transport or car-pooling.</p>
